

Oronce Fine's famous double cordiform map of the world is acknowledged as being one of the most striking and influential world maps published in the c.16th.

HENRICUS HONDIUS II (1597 - 1651) [POLUS ANTARCTICUS]

Polus Antarcticus, published in 1652, is one of the earliest printed maps to show Abel Tasman's discoveries on the western coastline of New Holland, 'Nova Hollandia detect Anno 1644', the southern tip of Van Diemen's Land and part of the west coast of New Zealand. The large vignettes surrounding the hemispherical map depict scenes from South America and the Pacific region.





Title pages printed in red and black. Main part of text is Greek words arranged alphabetically, in double columns, with footnotes in Latin. Volume One published 1746, Volume Two published 1766.

"Hesychius of Alexandia, lexicographer [. . .] probably belongs to the fifth century A.D. [. . .] The lexicon is known only from a fifteenth-century manuscript, badly preserved" - entry on Hesychius in Oxford Classical Dictionary (second edition, 1970).

Lacking the frontispiece. Volume One with splitting to vellum along most of front joint. Two conjugate preliminary leaves with signatures *3 and *4 in Volume One are detached together and loose. Title leaf to Volume Two has a large 170mm unrepaired tear, without loss.

Gutters split at hinges. The Errata listed on leaf a6v (11 in Vol. I) have been neatly corrected on the pages where they occur in an early ink hand.

Mary Russell Mitford (1787-1855) was an English author best known for Our Village (1824), a series of sketches of village scenes and vividly drawn characters based upon her life in Three Mile Cross near Reading in Berkshire. Her earliest published works were poetry and Christina, the Maid of the South Seas, was her second published title in 1811. A metrical tale based on the first news of discovery of the last surviving mutineer of the H. M. S. Bounty and a generation of British-Tahitian children on Pitcairn Island in 1811. The time occupied by the action is four nights and four days. [Ferguson, 519]. As a manuscript, the work was apparently read and corrected by James Burney who sailed with Captain James Cook and the proofs were corrected by Samuel Taylor Coleridge. 

Scarce first edition in one volume of this fictional-factual account of life in colonial New South Wales. London-born Harris enlisted in the Guards, deserted and fled to Australia in 1825 where he remained until 1840. Along with 'The Emigrant Family', "Harris provides the most realistic and comprehensive accounts of early colonial life in Australia. They have been a valuable reference source for social historians, who have found in them informed and accurate comments on such features of the colonial scene as the convict system, the Aborigines, land reform, modes of transport, bushrangers, urban and outback life-styles. Nor are they negligible as literature." (The Oxford Companion to Australian Literature, p346). (7728)



Recognised as the first English story for children with an Australian goldfields setting, this bound volume of the Leisure Hour contains the original 61 chapters published over 26 weekly parts as the lead story between January 5th and June 29th 1854. Each part is illustrated with black and white engravings. No author was provided and it was not until 1865 when the work appeared in an abridged book form that Sargent was acknowledged as the author. 

The only known leaf in Australia from this magnificent Bible likely commissioned by Edward III's eldest son, Edward of Woodstock, (1330-1376), known as "The Black Prince".


The Bohun family were the Earls of Hereford and Essex and were intimately connected with the royal court. Their lineage in England goes back to Humphrey de Bohun, who arrived in 1066 with William the Conqueror. They and their immediate circle were the most important patrons of book illumination in England in the fourteenth century. Eventually the last Bohun heiress, Mary, married the future Henry IV and became the mother of Henry V.

A huge (448x310 mm.) single parchment leaf, taken from the original four-volume set. The illuminated initial 'F' in raised and brightly burnished gold begins Chapter 2 of Ecclesiasticus. The leaf-by-leaf dispersal of the Bohun Bible began in the 17th century and was completed in 1927 by Myers & Co. on Bond Street, London, finding homes for them in many institutional and private collections throughout the world. While there are several leaves in New Zealand, none are known to be in Australia.

The extremely small size of this leaf can be explained thus: Medieval piety involved substantial elements of public display, and the small but emergent urban bourgeoisie, mostly merchants or administrators in the growing royal bureaucracies were intent on imitating their superiors. So the Book of Hours became something of a chic devotional accessory, especially for women, an incongruity that occasionally attracted disapproving comment. 

Her series, "The Peasants' War", is a socio-political manifesto in which strong female figures are no longer outsiders or simply participants, but provocateurs of revolt.

"Revolt" is one of Kollwitz's most famous prints, showing the spirit of revolution hovering in the air over an army of protesters.

Art dealer Alexander von der Becke took over the inventory of Käthe Kollwitz's unsold prints as well as her printing plates after the bankruptcy of her previous publisher. This impression is from der Becke's 1946/48 printing of Revolt.

The Lumen Animae (Light of the Soul), was compiled about 1300. It gathers together quotations from authors as diverse as Aristotle, Theophrastus, the elder Pliny, Ptolemy, Solinus, Ambrose, Augustine, Jerome, Isidore, Hugh of St Victor, and Avicenna to form a handbook of medieval knowledge of all sorts. It was immensely popular in the 15th century as a reference work, a late medieval bestseller.

Text in Latin printed on laid rag paper. Two Lombard calligraphic initials at the chapter headings in blue and red. Two further penned initials on the Verso. 275x200. mm. Chapter 199 is titled De pusillanimitate (On cowardice).

The compiler, Berengarius de Landora, was a French Dominican born into a noble family of Southern France. Later in life he became the Archbishop of Santiago de Compostela and one of the cathedral's towers bears his name.







The first retrospective exhibition in Australia of her work came in 2002 (Stella Bowen; Art, Love & War). Her art has been further acknowledged through the NGA's "Know My Name" initiative, and in the upcoming "Dangerously Modern: Australian Women Artists in Europe 1890-1940" exhibition through the Art Galleries of SA and NSW.



In January 1900, at the age of 22, Jack travelled with his father, Robert Logan Jack (1845-1921), pioneer geologist and the first Government Geologist for Queensland, to select and acquire mines in the Western Chinese province of Szechuan, on behalf of an Anglo-Belgian Company. Chengtu (Chengdu), the capital, served as a starting point for research trips to record the deposits of mineral resources on the Chinese-Tibetan border on behalf of English companies. Jack's lively and detailed description of the methods and incidents of the 1400 mile (2250 km) journey on the Yangtze offer fascinating insights into life and customs along the great river at that time, as well as (mindful of his audience) very detailed descriptions of sailing vessels.


This beautiful colour advertisement poster promotes the moth-proof serge kimono fabric from Budōseru (Grape Brand Serge). Serge kimonos became highly fashionable in Japan around the turn of the 20th century. The merino wool was imported from Australia, being regarded as the most suitable fibre for single-layer kimonos. However, woollen fabrics were susceptible to insect damage. To combat this issue, the Grape Brand Serge manufacturer developed a mothproofing treatment utilising chemicals from the German company Bayer. According to the poster, Bayer's compounds were used, and their treated serge was marked on the selvedge as "moth-proof Budo serge". This processing took place at their factory in Aichi Prefecture.

In the foreground, a classical Japanese beauty graces a hillside, elegantly attired in a purple kimono with a parasol in her hand. Her black obi bears an unusual rainbow design. The artist's signature appears in the lower left corner.

Over a 20-year period, he produced some 100 works, many of them translations into English."

The Golden Legend is "one of the largest books Caxton ever printed, a folio volume of just under 900 pages produced on extralarge Royal paper. Described by Blades as his magnum opus - a 'tremendous undertaking' - it was expensive and difficult to produce such a large-scale work. Indeed, at one point, he nearly abandoned the project in despair. However, according to the work's preface,



The film was shot around Melbourne. The outdoor scenes were probably filmed at the estate of Charles Tait's wife's family near Heidelberg. Some of the interior scenes were shot on sets built in the back garden of Tait's home. The film opened at the Athenaeum Theatre on Collins Street on 26 December 1906. It ran for five weeks to full houses. The film opened at the Palace Theatre in Sydney in February 1907 and then moved to Adelaide and Brisbane.



It appears that Mr Wood took part in aiding Whitlam during the ensuing constitutional crisis, as the text reads: "With justice on our side we have embarked on our crusade for democracy I wish you courage and good fortune in all you are doing for Labors cause and appeal to you in the weeks ahead for the final exertion of mind and spirit that will carry us on to victory / Gough Whitlam". This telegram was date stamped two days after a huge ALP rally in Sydney, on 24/11/1975, which drew a crowd of 30,000 people and seemed to suggest a victory for Labor

Much of the correspondence in this collection pertains to the process of editing Cohen's books on Whitlam. Whitlam's tone in the letters about Cohen's writing is familiar, humorous, but also firm and at times somewhat abrasive, while other personal correspondence is warm and respectful, suggesting a close and affectionate working relationship with Cohen.

The collection also includes an undated sketch in ballpoint pen, titled "Gough" and signed by "R. F[orster?]", c1970s.





Rare and very interesting lithograph depicting 2 busts of indigenous from North and East Tasmania. Lithographed from a photograph, in its turn a plaster model of the subject taken from life, during Dumont d'Urville's visit to Tasmania.

The two busts from which these copies were made are conserved in the Musée de l'Homme in Paris. Ultimately realised in the publication, Voyage au Pôle Sud et dans L'Océanie, the lithograph depicts busts of indigenous from Tasmania.

Dumoutier was commissioned by Dumont d'Urville to collect casts and busts of the indigenous populations of each site visited over the course of the voyage. The material collect was used to substantiate Dumont d'Urville's belief in a stratified racial hierarchy among the inhabitants of the South Pacific region. In Dumoutier's skulls and busts, the figure becomes a specimen to be studied.

NOTE: This rare lithograph test, a first in terms of use of photography in Anthropology, was made from a daguerreotype by the Bisson brothers and is an early attempt to reproduce for publication the material collected during Dumont d'Urville's exploration to South Pole.



From the preface: "Good Food" came into being during the period [Newington] was interned (sic) in Changi Criminal Prison and Sime Road Camp, Singapore, by the Japanese from February 1942 up to date of our release in August 1945. It is an extraordinary thing how one's thoughts turn to food when one is starving. Our food had steadily been decreased until our staple dish in May 1945 was 4 ozs of rice a day. I started in the Changi days by writing down in a note book all the recipes that I could remember and when I was transferred to Sime Road Camp I started a Gourmets Club which was called "Good Food". The Club would meet on





the embankment outside my hut, once a week and for an hour food was discussed as follows:- A menu was produced and each course from Cocktails to Savouries was discussed in detail, ingredients, method of cooking, serving, etc. Notes were taken by those interested and after everyone had dined sumptuously in imagination, a Speaker was appointed for the next meeting."

Recipes were also secretly exchanged with ladies in the Women's Camp; all of which combined became the book "Good Food".
