The Second James Flood Book of Early Motoring (Item 207), The Third James Flood Book of early Motoring (Item 209) and The Fourth James Flood Book of early Motoring (Item 208) are all from the definitive series by the largest body building shops of vintage cars, now no longer in existence.

We have a number of impressive sets that are sure to enhance any collector's bookshelf. *The Collected works of Rudyard Kipling* (Item 152), noted novelist and poet, are celebrated in the handsomely bound 28 Volume Burwash Edition set. Students of Australian History will have plenty to learn from Charles Manning Clark's Commemorative 6 Volume edition of *A History of Australia* (Item 59) and the full set of *Historical Records of Australia* (Item 130) which is complete with the rare folio volume, 'The Beginnings of Government in Australia'.
