## FOREWORD

On October 29, 1969, researchers at the Stanford Research Institute connected a computer at Stanford's campus to another computer at UCLA. The message was sent over telephone lines, but unlike a telephone call, the new technology broke the data down into fragments called "packets", each of which took the quickest possible path to the destination, before being reassembled at the second computer. The Internet was born!

Initially the Pentagon was its patron and it just linked universities together, however the military were concerned about the laid-back security approach of the universities and formed its own secure network, MILNET.

Much later research was done and in 1989, the British computer scientist Tim Berners-Lee designed a system of "hypertext" which linked information digitally, calling it the "World Wide Web" upon which we now depend on a daily basis.

In my pre-books life I had graduated from the UNSW School of Electrical Engineering in 1964 where much cutting-edge research was taking place. This was pre-Internet but it was an exciting time to be involved in technology. Just how much we are dependent on the Internet was brought home to us all last week when a world-wide outage occurred which had implications for many organisations.

I was affected in a minor way because on the day it happened I was taking a Qantas flight from Melbourne to Sydney in the late afternoon. Qantas cancelled my original booked flight and re-booked me on another, but I arrived at the airport to find that the staff were boarding people manually as their on-line booking system was out of action. This was taking a long time.

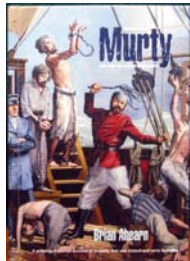
It shows that a total meltdown of the Internet, perhaps even organised by a hostile actor, would totally cripple our normal activities.

The banks are doing their best to eliminate cash, but without their on-line systems and no cash available economic activity might well diminish catastrophically. Internet security is paramount!

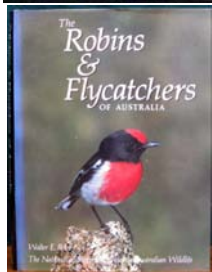
